Homestay provides students with the opportunity to use English or French in real life situations. Students get a first hand look at the way Canadians live. Our largest concentration of English/French homestays are in LaSalle, Notre-Dame-de Grace, Rosemont and Ville St-Laurent. In Canada it is usual that the homestay providers work outside the home during the day. Classic students are responsible for going to school and returning to their homestay by themselves.

Meals

Hosts serve three meals daily: breakfast, a packed lunch and dinner. They include the four basic food groups: protein (meat, fish), carbohydrates (bread, pasta, rice), dairy products (milk, cheese, eggs), fruit and vegetables

BREAKFAST

Juice and/or milk, fruit, cereal and/or muffins, toast/bagels

LUNCH

Sandwich (ex. sliced turkey, cheese, tomato and lettuce), fruit and vegetables (ex. apple, orange, banana, carrot and celery sticks), juice box, snacks (ex. pretzels, nuts, crackers)

DINNER

Pasta, salad, bread and cheese, dessert and/or fruit (optional)

Or

Roast chicken and potatoes, cooked vegetables, dessert and/or fruit (optional)

DIETARY REQUIREMENTS

If students require a vegetarian diet we must be informed of this prior to a student's arrival.

Learning Centre

Lessons take place at Dawson College which is located in the heart of downtown Montreal in a building on 12 acres of green space. All the classrooms are modern, air-conditioned and spacious. There is a cafeteria and snack bar on site. The college is connected to an underground shopping centre and food court. It is also a few steps away from one of Montreal's largest entertainment complexes, the Pepsi Forum.

Students attending the Classic Montreal program will attend a General English/French course - 20 lessons (45 mins each) per week. The course will help improve English/French language skills by focusing on the key areas: reading, writing, speaking and listening. A strong focus is placed on speech and using the language confidently and fluently.

Our dedicated and professional teaching staff will provide feedback and support and help students build confidence to speak English or French.

International classes

Lessons are always held in the morning

Free Wi-Fi is available. Wireless internet is password protected. Students can also make use of the computers upon their return to campus



Academic Rules

Attendance in class is required. If students are sick they must notify the school immediately

Punctuality is required

All classes begin promptly at 9am

English or French are the only languages spoken at school and in the classes

Students must respect their fellow students' cultural and ethnic background.

Intolerance, harassment or discrimination is not tolerated

Food and drink is not permitted in the classroom or in the computer room

Students will be required to pay for any damages

FIRST DAY

On the first day, students go to Montreal school (1610 St. Catherine Street West, Suite 401) at 8:15am for testing and first day information session. After evaluation, registration and orientation, students will be taken on a tour of the Classic Montreal Campus. Students begin their activities on the first day. The next day, students go directly to the campus.

Students are to bring their passport and their airline ticket to school on the first day

EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS

Educational materials are provided. Students should bring their own notepaper and pens.

ATTENDANCE

Activity Rules

Attendance to all pre-paid and afternoon activities is mandatory. Punctuality for all activities is mandatory. If you are late for an activity that is time sensitive, the activity will continue as scheduled. No refund will be issued for missed activities. English and French are the only languages spoken on all activities. Students are to respect their activity leaders, fellow students and their surroundings. Students will be taken outside the main TLA campus for their activity, therefore, it is essential that the students stay with the group at all times and follow all activity instructions carefully. Supervision is provided during all activities.

After all afternoon activities, Leaders return the students to the Montreal's Centre. Students have approximately 1-2 hours to use the internet and email in the Student Resource Centre following afternoon activities. Alternatively they can explore the city with their friends



Welfare, Rules and Disciplinary Action

ALCOHOL CONSUMPTION

The legal drinking age in Quebec is 18 years. It is illegal for all students attending this course to consume alcohol, have someone buy alcohol on their behalf or visit bars/clubs.

DRUGS

Using drugs, being under the influence of drugs or possessing drugs is illegal. Under no circumstances should students use, possess or be under the influence of drugs.

False ID

Being in possession of false identification is fraud and is illegal in Canada.

Course Certificate

Students must attend all lessons and organized activities in order to receive their End of Course Certificate

Parent's Permission

Parents/guardians must sign the Young Student Waiver giving emergency details, and their consent and permission for their child to receive medical treatment and attend activities.

ACCOMMODATION RULES

The student must call their homestay by 4:30pm if they are going to be late for dinner or if they are not going to join their homestay for dinner

No overnight guests

A phone card must be used for all long distance phone calls

Students should lock the door when leaving the homestay

Students must keep their room clean and tidy at all times

Students must advise their homestay hosts of where they are going and at what time they will be home

Homestay hosts set times for students to be home during the week and weekends. Students must obey and respect these times

SMOKING

The legal age to buy tobacco is 18 years. It is illegal to buy tobacco or have someone buy tobacco on the student's behalf if they are under the legal smoking age.

EXPULSION

Failure to follow any of the above rules will result in immediate expulsion from the program with no refund. Students' parents will be notified immediately and the student will be sent home at their own expense. Depending on the severity of the situation, breaking any of the above rules may result in a monetary fine, arrest, jail sentence or deportation by the Canadian police.

CUSTOMER COMPLAINTS

We strive to provide our students with the highest possible level of service. If, however, a student is unsatisfied with any aspect of their program, we ask that they inform us immediately. Most problems are small and can be quickly resolved by our staff members. During the first week of school, all students are given an Initial Course Evaluation form, in which they are asked to evaluate various aspects of their stay, such as tuition, accommodation and leisure. The form also allows students the opportunity to bring to our attention anything that is not to their satisfaction should they feel unable to speak to us directly. Solutions to any issues will be provided and all necessary parties will be notified when applicable. Students are also requested to complete an End of Course Evaluation form at the end of their stay such that they have the opportunity to provide us with general feedback before returning to their home country.
