PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

This Study & Internship program combines a minimum 4 week Standard Group German Study program followed up with a minimum 12 week Internship Work Experience placement in the community. All internship opportunities will work in partnership with local people in a variety of community-based projects. This unique program offers exciting hands-on work opportunities, meaningful cultural immersion, and an enriching language program.



CITY AND COUNTRY INFO

Founded in 1158, Munich (München) has been the capital of Bavaria since 1503, and as far as the locals are concerned it may as well be the center of the universe. Münchener pride themselves on their special status; even people who have made Munich their home for most of their lives are still called Zugereiste (newcomers). Next to Berlin, Munich is Germany's most popular city, with everything you'd expect in a cosmopolitan capital. Yet it's small enough to be digestible in one visit, and it's got the added bonus of a great setting, with the mountains and Alpine lakes just an hour's drive away. The best time of year to come here is from June to early October, when the beer gardens, street cafés and bars are in full swing.

Munich is situated at the edge of the Alps and is one of the greenest and most beautiful cities in Germany. Munich has been able to preserve its unique charm, expressed through its beautiful architecture with buildings from several eras and the typical lifestyle of its people: a mixture of tradition and receptiveness towards modern life. It is not only an international city, it is also a cultural leader which offers an extraordinary variety of leisure attractions.

FULL PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

STUDY PROGRAM

All students complete a minimum of 4 weeks in a Group 20 hours per week German study program. Each class consists of a maximum of 12 students per class and each class is 45 minutes in duration.

The goal of each course is to improve the student's active and passive language ability and develop understanding of German culture and the German way of thinking. All courses are taught exclusively in German and are open to all levels. Students are obliged to attend all lessons on time. All students should bring a dictionary, paper and pens/pencils. All other teaching material will be provided to students.

INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

German companies participating in the internship program require a minimum German language proficiency level of high intermediate in order to accept individuals into the program and a minimum of 12 week work commitment.

LODGING OPTIONS

HOST FAMILY

Living in a German host family is the best and most interesting way to learn the German language and to get an insight into the German way of life. This is why most of our students prefer to be accommodated with families. The host may be a family with children, an older couple or a single person. Our student shares the bathroom and kitchen with their hosts.

SHARED APARTMENTS/STUDENT RESIDENCE

Students are housed in shared apartments inhabited by one or more German person. Each student has a single room in the apartment and you will share bathroom and kitchen; a good option if you'd like some service from your German host but don't want to be confined by having to integrate into their everyday life. Student Apartments is a popular form of living among Germans, especially in bigger cities. You have a single room in an apartment you share with one or more Germans and take care of all meals yourself. The Germans are between 20 and 40, either students at Berlin universities or professionals. Often you develop close contacts with the Germans in your apartment.

PRICE RANGE

Cost of minimum 4 weeks of classes, minimum of 12 weeks of internship placement, and minimum of 16 weeks of housing ranges from:

ELIGIBILITY AND GUIDELINES

U.S. citizens traveling on regular passports for tourism or business do not need a visa for a stay of 90 days or less. Those planning a longer visit must obtain a visa in advance of arrival.

Minimum age of 18 undergraduate, graduate students and adults with an undergraduate degree or higher are eligible.

Internship positions on a space available basis. These are unpaid positions and there is a limited number of positions every month.

ACTIVITIES AND EXCURSIONS

Available to all students is a highly varied program of social activities all of which are undertaken with the teachers. The social activities allow students to improve their German, make new friends from all over the world, and simply enjoy themselves.

Students will also have an opportunity to meet people at the many events organized at the NRCSA Center including international evenings, film shows, games, competitions and parties.

Outside the classroom there are plenty of opportunities to enjoy other aspects of German life and culture. Local coordinators can arrange for guided sight-seeing tours and visits to museums, cultural events, pubs and discos.
