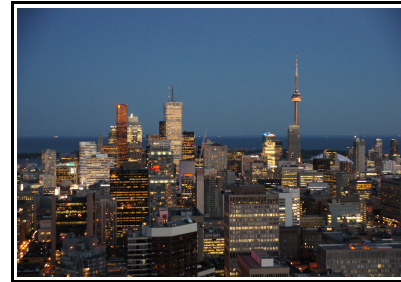

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

This Study & Internship program combines a minimum 4 week Standard Group English Study program followed up with a minimum 4 week Internship Work Experience placement in the community. All internship opportunities will work in partnership with local people in a variety of community-based projects. This unique program offers exciting hands-on work opportunities, meaningful cultural immersion, and an enriching language program.



CITY AND COUNTRY INFO

Toronto is a culturally diverse city, and has neighborhoods that offer cuisine from around the world. It has seven full-scale production theaters and a host of smaller theaters that operate throughout the year. The city is famous for its International Film Festival held in September. The Royal Ontario Museum and the Art Gallery of Ontario are among the finest in the world.

Set on the northern shore of Lake Ontario, Toronto provides two very popular entertainment sites: Harbourfront and Ontario Place. Harbourfront is a large mall with unique shops and restaurants. Ontario Place is a huge entertainment park. In the summer months, it features world-class bands on an outdoor stage.

Toronto is a major cultural center. The city also offers a full range of sports activities for every season. It is easy to get away to the Canadian outdoors. A one hour drive north of the city takes you to "cottage country," a natural wilderness of forests and lakes; one hour to the south is Niagara Falls.

After participating in this Study & Internship Program in Toronto, students will gain unique cross-cultural professional experience, greatly improved foreign language abilities, personal and professional growth and confidence both nationally and internationally, and culturally sensitive yet sound communication skills.

FULL PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

STUDY PROGRAM

The teaching approach focuses on all basic language skills; listening, speaking, reading and writing. Students learn vocabulary and structure, progressing from basic to advanced conversational ability. Classes are small with a maximum of 14 students and often with only 6 or 7. The small group size assures you of maximum individual participation and attention from the teacher.

Instruction is offered at up to 10 levels from elementary to advanced. Students are given an evaluation test upon arrival and are placed in the appropriate group. A team of teachers, working in rotation, will personally guide you in your studies. They will tutor you in the four language skills: listening, speaking, reading and writing. With the assistance of audio cassettes, overhead projectors, video and other visual aids, your team will instruct you in grammar, correct pronunciation and the use of everyday idiomatic language. Classes are held Monday through Friday with a morning session and the afternoon session. Each class has a duration of 60 minutes.

INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

After the minimum 4 week study program, there is a 4 week minimum internship placement in a business or organization in Toronto or the surrounding areas.

Students should indicate on their application form which sector or industry they are interested in working in (e.g. tourism, insurance, architecture, etc.). We will then do our best to find a position in a company working in each student's preferred field. Please note that the more specialized the request, the more difficult it is to find a suitable company. Similarly, if students are prepared to be flexible, finding a company willing to offer work experience will normally be relatively quick and straightforward.

LODGING OPTIONS

HOMESTAY

Homestays with Canadian families are arranged by the school. Family accommodation includes a single room, breakfast and dinner 7 days per week. Laundry of sheets and towels is done once a week. The school carefully inspects all homes, and admits only families of good reputation to their accommodation service. The demand for family accommodation is great and requests are filled on a first come first served basis. Most homes are within a maximum 60 minutes of the school by public transportation.

Accommodation is available from the Saturday immediately preceding a course start date unless noted otherwise. You must leave your accommodation by 11:00 a.m. on the Saturday immediately following your course end date. If you want to arrive earlier or depart later, please contact NRCSA to make special arrangements.

STUDENT RESIDENCE

Residence accommodation is ideal for independent travelers. The residence is located in the downtown area of Toronto with easy access to the school, close to shopping, tourist attractions and restaurants. The residence provides a safe and economical way to enjoy your stay. Single room accommodation is provided with a shared kitchenette, bath and TV lounge on each floor. Rooms are cleaned once a week, with bed linen and towels provided. The residence is about 25 minutes by public transit to the school and there is a nearby cafeteria. Access to the on-site pool, squash, tennis, gym, weight room is available. The school can make reservations for students at hotels or apartment-hotels upon request and at additional cost.

PRICE RANGE

Cost of minimum 4 weeks of classes, minimum of 4 weeks of internship placement and orientation, and minimum of 8 weeks total of housing ranges between:

ELIGIBILITY AND GUIDELINES

U.S. citizens traveling with regular passports for tourism or business do not need a visa for a stay of 90 days or less. Those planning a longer visit must obtain a visa in advance of arrival.

Minimum age of 18 undergraduate, graduate students and adults with an undergraduate degree or higher are eligible. Prior experience or classes in the field of the internship placement and a English background (Advanced English level) are required. Internship positions on a space available basis. These are unpaid positions and there is a limited number of positions every month.

ACTIVITIES

Toronto offers an exciting variety of cultural and tourist activities. The school organizes small group excursions on a regular basis where students and teachers visit interesting and entertaining places. These trips are not considered a part of the regular curriculum and are optional with transportation, entrance fees, etc. to be paid by student.
