PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

This Study & Internship program combines a minimum 4 week Standard Group German Study program followed up with a minimum 4 week Internship Work Experience placement in the community. All internship opportunities will work in partnership with local people in a variety of community-based projects. This unique program offers exciting hands-on work opportunities, meaningful cultural immersion, and an enriching language program.



CITY AND COUNTRY INFO

The capital of Austria and home to 2 million residents, Vienna is situated on the banks of the Danube. The influx of visitors from all over the world has made Vienna the most popular urban tourist destination in Austria. The city's location, not far from the splendors of Budapest and Prague, has made it a hotline to Eastern Europe, as well as a major center of modern business and cultural life. It is said that the most melodic German is spoken in the old city.

Vienna is a romantic, imperial city, with highlights including the magnificent Imperial Palace, majestic Schönbrunn Palace, and the magic of Ringstraße. What was once the heart of the Austro-Hungarian monarchy is now the stuff dreams are made of. Discover the glory and the splendor of Vienna, the city of art, culture and music; a safe and attractive place to learn German. Vienna is home to museums, exhibitions, theaters, concert halls and the world famous State Opera. Yet Viennese coffee houses, "Heuriger" - the name given by the Viennese to both the wine of the last harvest and the taverns where it is served - bars and clubs also make a trip to Vienna an unforgettable experience. Vienna's culinary diversity is also impressive. Delights such as semolina dumpling soup, tender boiled beef and apple strudel are typical Austrian dishes.

After participating in this Study & Internship Program in Vienna, students will gain unique cross-cultural professional experience, greatly improved foreign language abilities, personal and professional growth and confidence both nationally and internationally, and culturally sensitive yet sound communication skills.

FULL PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

STUDY PROGRAM

All students complete a minimum of 4 weeks in a Group 20 hours per week German study program. Each class consists of a maximum of 12 students per class and each class is 45 minutes in duration.

The goal of each course is to improve the student's active and passive language ability and develop understanding of German culture and the German way of thinking. All courses are taught exclusively in German and are open to all levels. Students are obliged to attend all lessons on time. All students should bring a dictionary, paper and pens/pencils. All other teaching material will be provided to students.

INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

After the minimum 4 week Study Program, students are then placed into a business or organization with in the community in the field of their choice. Some of the field and placement options include:

- Computing: CNC, CAD/CAM, software development.
- Tourism & marketing: Austrian Airlines (ground staff), travel agencies.
- Hotel Management in Vienna: reception, kitchen help
- Commerce: import/export firms, environmental consulting.
- Research: university institutes.
- Manual and art trades: carpenter, car mechanic.
- Sales: art galleries, souvenir shops, retail stores

After the internship each participant will get a detailed description and evaluation regarding the content and success of the internship from his or her employer.

LODGING OPTIONS

HOMESTAY

Stay with a host family in their home. The host families offered by the school include lodging with young childless couples, others with children of school age, and older people whose children no longer live in the home. Accommodation in host families is definitely the best way to practice German while getting to know Austria - its people and culture, outside the classroom.

A single room, shared bathroom and kitchen are included. Bed linen is provided and cleaned every two weeks, but please bring your own towels.

STUDENT RESIDENCE

Students who choose accommodation in a student residence have their own room. All residences are favorably located with rapid access to the city center. Some have a kitchen where students may use the hotplates and refrigerator free of charge, however, students must provide their own crockery and utensils. Most rooms have a private bath and telephone. Shared rooms are also available on request. Bed linen is provided and cleaned every 2 weeks, but please bring your own towels.

PRICE RANGE

Cost of minimum 4 weeks of classes, minimum of 4 weeks of internship placement, and minimum of 8 weeks of housing ranges from:

ELIGIBILITY AND GUIDELINES

U.S. citizens traveling on regular passports for tourism or business do not need a visa for a stay of 90 days or less. Those planning a longer visit must obtain a visa in advance of arrival.

Minimum age of 18 undergraduate, graduate students and adults with an undergraduate degree or higher are eligible.

Internship positions on a space available basis. These are unpaid positions and there is a limited number of positions every month.

ACTIVITIES AND EXCURSIONS

Afternoon and evening cultural and leisure activities and excursion enable students to experience the unique culture of Vienna, Austria, and its people.

Example activities can include:

- Special talks, discussions and videos about Austrian music, art, literature, history, architecture.
- Films
- Tours of the many sights of Vienna
- Parties
- Sports

Example excursions offered for an additional cost can include:

- Salzburg (the "Mozart city")
- Graz (the capital of Styria),
- Klosterneuburg (famous for its Babenberg heritage)
- Wachau region of the Danube valley
